Taking Your Dog Out for a Walk?

- Dogs must be securely attached to a leash with a maximum length of 3 metres when being walked along a sidewalk or roadway.
- At no time is a dog permitted to be running at large or causing a nuisance within the Town of Bracebridge.
- Owners must pick up and dispose of their pet's waste in all public places.

Visit the **Parks Beaches, Parks and Trails** page for information on pet-friendly public walking areas in Bracebridge. The Three Amigos Dog Park opened in James W. Kerr Park in 2015. The park is divided into small and large dog areas. **Rules** for using the park are posted near the entrance of the park. The Three Amigos Dog Park is monitored by the Friends of the Three Amigos Dog Park Group, a group of Town of Bracebridge volunteers. The group is looking for additional volunteers to join them, the **terms of reference** outlines the function of the group.

Persistent barking, whining or other similar noises from the dogs are not permitted. This prohibition is in effect 24 hours a day. View our **Noise Control in Bracebridge Brochure** for more information.

Dog Control Bylaw

Every dog within the Town of Bracebridge must be licensed annually.

Licence fees are \$10.00 per year for all dogs.

Every person in charge of a dog must pick up and dispose of dog feces in a sanitary manner.

Dog owners not allow their dogs to run "at large" at any time. Dogs must be kept on the owner's property or under control at all times when off the property.

Dogs picked up while running at large are impounded. Dog owners are responsible for paying all outstanding fines,

impound charges, boarding and veterinarian fees prior to their dog being released.
